Our robust one-on-one mentoring program is helping individuals and families develop the character traits of self-reliance, determination, and hope. The number of job-focused vocational courses that we provide doubled during 2021, and 63% of our students found employment or started their own business. Families are breaking their cycle of poverty and increasing their income with the support of Mentors International.

As we continue to extend our reach by leveraging technology, we are serving more communities in critical need, living in remote and previously inaccessible areas. During 2021 we opened two new areas in the indigenous communities of Hoctun, Mexico, and Senahú, Guatemala.

Thanks to the incredible outpouring of support from our generous community of donors, we have been able to respond in miraculous ways, providing hope and relief to many families in dire need.

As an organization, we have continually earned the highest rating from both Charity Navigator and Guidestar for our fiscal transparency. We will always be vigilant and mindful of how each sacred donated dollar is utilized for our programs.

What sets us apart

With our **Mentoring Multiplier** each donated dollar, on average, results in **3.7X** the economic impact in the lives of mentored families.

When our micro-loans are re-paid these funds are then lent to another. In essence $No\ Dollar\ Ever\ Dies\$ with our perpetual loan fund. $3,771\$ Micro-loans were dispersed while 90% of these loans are given to women. The average micro-loan is only \$132

There is no "out of pocket" cost for the programs we provide.

Students "pay" for their training by fulfilling a 40-hour obligation of approved service to their community. We call this **Service Currency**. **260,665**hours of service were performed in the name of Mentors

International.









One-On-One Mentoring

Mentoring is **key** to changing the circumstance of individuals struggling in 3rd world poverty.

One-by-one our mentors evaluate each mentee's circumstances, abilities, needs, and goals. Then, the mentee is guided through the appropriate training courses and financial solutions based on their

individual needs.

Our mentors guide and teach each mentee as they **continue to progress** until a level of sustainable self-reliance is reached. With mentoring, a newfound confidence **empowers individuals** to move forward building their successful futures.

These mentees go on to support and **build up the communities** in which they live, making the

ripple effect of Mentors International even greater.



Business Development and Job-Focused Vocational Training

During 2021 we improved our business development program resources during. We implemented new training tablets for our staff. Our Mentors are able to have all of the business lessons and video resources at hand to share with clients during their lessons.

During 2021 we **doubled** the number of vocational courses we provide. These courses help individuals qualify for steady jobs with higher paying wages.

Our courses are provided both online and in person where permissible. Our classes always have an instructor present, ready to support and answer any questions. Our training continues to be dynamic and customized to specific personal situations.

Our staff helps individuals apply for jobs, create their resume, and practice job interview techniques. We have developed many strong partnerships with local companies that hire from our qualified students.

Every individual also receives our **Keystone**

Personal Development Course.

Life principles are taught that help individuals evaluate their current situation while helping to inspire them to improve and make positive changes and set goals for the future. This course is offered in English, Spanish, Khemer, and Quechi.







During 2021 we opened two new Centers for Education and Mentoring. Our centers are centrally located where many families can readily access our facilities. These classrooms and computers support our students as they develop new indemand skills.

In May we opened a small satellite Center of Education and

Mentoring in **Tuxtla**, **Mexico**. We are able to provide mentoring and training to individuals and families that previously have not had many educational opportunities.

We are providing our programs to children ages 15-17 at a local orphanage. Helping them gain additional vocational skills before they age out of the system.

We are grateful to our amazing center director Carla. Her hard work and dedication is making sure that this new expansion is on track and ready for success.

In September other Center for Education and Mentoring

was opened in **Senahú, Guatemala**. We began with a class of 20 English and Keystone students. We are adding additional physical and virtual classes in the coming semesters and we continue our strong small business and agricultural mentoring and micro-lending operations supporting the indigenous communities throughout the Polochic valley.





Global Technology Center

As we continue to increase and expand our virtual training and mentoring programs, the additional volume of students and participants was generating higher numbers of simple, but tedious technical support requests. This is mainly due to participants being unfamiliar with computers.

That was when the idea of creating a **New Global**

Technology Center was put into action. During 2021 we opened our new center in Nicaragua and we promoted one of our programming staff to manage this new center.

Students who have taken courses from us are being trained how to answer these common, yet simple computer questions. These students are able to perform their service hours through volunteering at our Global Technical Center. In addition, they are gaining valuable work experience helping them qualify for higher-income jobs after they complete their vocational training from Mentors International.

Today our students are receiving quicker resolutions to their questions, and our programming team is able to work on programming our online infrastructure to help improve our ability to provide our business development and vocational training to all those who have a desire to change their lives.

A generous donor provided the funding for additional computers and equipment to aid us in launching this new program.







Indigenous Populations

During 2021 Mentors International in Mexico expanded and begin serving the indigenous populated communities in the

Hoctún Municipality

Because of their isolated location, many families have lived in extreme poverty for generations. In Mexico, it is estimated that 43% of the Indigenous populations have not completed primary school, and more than half of them work in manual, and low-skilled labor jobs.

Mentors International set up five new classrooms in donated space within local community centers. Refurbished computers were donated by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints to help facilitate these new learning opportunities.

Mentors International partnered with "The Unconnected" a UK-based B-Corp, to provide modems, routers, and Internet connection for our new centers.

This is the first time many have had the chance to work on a computer and have access to endless information through an Internet connection. Having a professional teacher to safely guide them through Internet-enhanced learning is priceless.
